WAYS TO GET INVOLVED

VOLUNTEER AS A MENTOR

Community-Based Mentoring

Volunteer mentors (Bigs) are matched with a mentee (Little) who lives within 30 minutes of where they live. The pair meets on weekends or after school to enjoy one-on-one activities together like playing sports, visiting the library, or just going for a walk and talking. Bigs spend time with their Little 2-4 times per month and need to make a minimum oneyear commitment.

School-Based Mentoring

Sometimes the best place for a mentoring pair to enjoy activities together is through structured programs at the young person's school. This is a great opportunity for Bigs who have limited availability on weekends.

School-based Option 1: Russell Byers Charter School

Adults who live or work in Center City are matched as a mentor to an elementary or middle school aged student at Russell Byers Charter School (located at 19th and Arch). Bigs visit their Little once per week during the 45-minute lunch period, and can choose any day of the week that works best with their schedule. Pairs enjoy talking and eating lunch, playing games, and doing art during their time together. Visits occur only at the school during the school year and Bigs should be able to make at least a one school year commitment.


School-based Option 2:


Mentor 2.0

Mentors in this program have experience in one of the 4 E's (Enrollment, Employment, Enlistment, Entrepreneurship) and are matched with a high school student at either our Center City or Camden location. Mentoring pairs use an interactive online curriculum to navigate the post-secondary planning process as a team, and meet once per month in person at the school in the evening, only during the school year. A minimum of one school year commitment is required, but ideally pairs are stay matched for all four years of high school.

LGBTQ+ Focused

Pride Empowerment Program:

Mentors who identify within the LGBTQ+ community are matched with a GSA (Gender Sexuality Alliance) space at a high school or middle school, and volunteer along BBBSI staff and school staff to support students in a group mentoring structured space.

• Rainbow Bigs:

We serve a diverse group of young people with varying preferences for the mentor they would like to be matched with. Rainbow Bigs are mentors who identify as LGBTQ+ that are matched with a young person in our community-based program, who hasmade a specific request to be matched with a Big who identifies within this community.
